## Adjuncts suffer from anxiety, depression due to working conditions

Research published in *Frontiers* of Psychology suggests that adjunct professors are at high risk for stress, depression, and anxiety brought about because of working conditions. The authors write, "[non-tenuretrack] faculty perceive stressors at work that are related to their contingent positions". They propose a number of interventions that universities could implement to help mitigate the impact of these stressors.
