**Re:** **Call for Nominations for Donald C. Savage Award**

CAUT is soliciting nominations for the CAUT Donald C. Savage Award. The Award was established in 1997 in honour of Donald C. Savage, Executive Director of CAUT 1972-1997, and was instituted to honour and to recognize outstanding achievements in the promotion of collective bargaining in Canadian universities and colleges.

## Criteria

- Candidates need not be a member of the academic community but the results of their contribution(s) must have benefitted the cause of collective bargaining in the post-secondary sector.
- The outstanding quality of the contribution may derive from the result of a single project or activity, or the accumulation of efforts through consistent involvement over a long period of time in supporting the cause of collective bargaining in the post-secondary sector.
- Candidates' contributions which have had national implications for the collective bargaining process may have been focused locally (in a single university *or college*), provincially, regionally, nationally, or a combination of these.

Nominations for the award may be submitted by academic staff associations or any other interested parties or individuals. **The deadline for nominations is February 1, 2018.**

The nomination form and procedures are available on the [CAUT website](#). Nominations will be reviewed by CAUT's Collective Bargaining and Economic Benefits Committee and recommendations will be forwarded to CAUT Council. The number and frequency of awards will be as the Committee and CAUT Council deem appropriate.
